Matteo spent a visiting period in Cambridge (MA), where he attended the Sloan School of Management of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and where he wrote part of his graduate dissertation.

During these years, Matteo developed a strong background in microeconomics, later widened during his PhD years, when his interest in economic theory became prominent.
